HEALTH RULES FOR ALL CATTLE - HEALTH CERTIFICATION

HEALTH OF ANIMALS

No animal showing signs of infectious, contagious, or external parasitic disease will be allowed into the Pennsylvania Farm Show Complex & Expo Center. However, exhibitors who observe an animal that may present a health hazard to other animals are asked to report the stall location to the show committee. The official show veterinarian in consultation with Show Management shall be responsible for determining the health status of all animals. Animals showing evidence of infectious, contagious, or external parasitic diseases shall be removed by their owner from the show grounds at the direction of Show Management.

HEALTH CERTIFICATION DOCUMENTS

No animal will be allowed into the Pennsylvania Farm Show Complex & Expo Center unless they are accompanied by the required health certification documents. Additionally, the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection must be available for inspection upon request at all times while the animal is on the premises.

VETERINARIAN-CLIENT-PATIENT-RELATIONSHIP

By entry into the exposition you are confirming that you have established a Veterinarian-Client-Patient-Relationship for the animals you are entering and/or exhibiting. A Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship is a relationship in which the veterinarian has assumed the responsibility for making veterinary medical judgments regarding the health of the animal and the need for veterinary medical treatment and the owner or caretaker of the animal has agreed to follow the instructions of the veterinarian in relation to zoonotic diseases.

VACCINATION RECOMMENDATION

It is highly recommended that all animals entering the show be immunized against IBR, PI3, BVD, BRSV, and rabies. It is strongly recommended that at least one vaccination against IBR, PI3, BVD, BRSV, and rabies be given after January 1, 2011.

HEALTH RULES FOR PENNSYLVANIA EXHIBITION CATTLE

1. **Certificate of Veterinary Inspection:** Pennsylvania cattle must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection signed, dated and issued by an accredited veterinarian.

ian within the 30 days prior to the date of arrival at the show.

2. **Cattle Identification Requirements:** All cattle for exhibition must be identified by a USDA-issued metal eartag; a breed registration tattoo if the tattoo is legible; a breed registration eartag; or an ISO-compliant 15-digit eartag (including RFID).
3. No tuberculosis test is required.
4. No brucellosis test is required.
5. **Vaccination Recommendations:** It is highly recommended that all animals entering the show be immunized against IBR, PI3, BVD, BRSV, and rabies.

HEALTH RULES FOR OUT-OF-STATE EXHIBITION CATTLE

1. **Certificate of Veterinary Inspection:** Out-of-state cattle must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection signed, dated and issued by an accredited veterinarian within the 30 days prior to the date of arrival at the show. The accredited veterinarian must send a copy of the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection to the State Veterinarian of the state of origin for approval.
2. **Cattle Identification Requirements:** All cattle for exhibition must be identified by a USDA-issued metal eartag; a breed registration tattoo if the tattoo is legible; a breed registration eartag; or an ISO-compliant 15-digit eartag (including RFID).
3. **Tuberculosis Testing Requirements:**
 - (a). Test-eligible animals shall be all cattle of all ages.
 - (b). If the animal originates from a Tuberculosis-free state or zone, no tuberculosis test is required.
 - (c). If the animal originates from a state or zone that is classified as Modified Advanced Accredited (MAA), the animal shall be tuberculosis test negative within the 60 days prior to the date of arrival at the show. The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection shall include all test results and dates of those tests.
 - (d). If the animal originates from a state or zone that is classified as Modified Accredited (MA), the animal shall originate from a herd which was negative on a whole herd test (all animals 12 months of age and older shall be tested) within the 12 months prior to the date of arrival at the show, and the individual animal to be exhibited (all ages) must be test negative at least 60 days after the whole herd test and within the 60 days prior to the date of arrival at the show. The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection shall include all test results and dates of those tests.
4. **Brucellosis Testing Requirements:**
 - (a). Test-eligible animals shall be all unvaccinated cattle over eight months of age and calfhooed vaccinated animals over 14 months of age. Steers are exempt from brucellosis testing requirements.
 - (b). If the animal originates from a Brucellosis-free state, no brucellosis test is required.
 - (c). If the animal originates from a Brucellosis Class A, B or C state the animal shall be brucellosis test negative within the 60 days prior to the date of arrival at the show.
5. **Vaccination Recommendations:** It is highly recommended that all animals entering the show be immunized against IBR, PI3, BVD, BRSV, and rabies.

HEALTH RULES FOR SALE CATTLE

1. **Certificate of Veterinary Inspection:** Sale cattle must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection signed, dated and issued by an accredited veterinarian on or after September 9, 2011. The accredited veterinarian must send a copy of the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection to the State Veterinarian of the state of origin for

approval.

2. **Identification:** All cattle for sale must be identified by a USDA-issued metal eartag; a breed registration tattoo if the tattoo is legible; a breed registration eartag; or an ISO-compliant 15-digit eartag (including RFID).
3. **Tuberculosis Testing Requirements:**
 - (a). All sale cattle shall be negative on an individual animal test for tuberculosis on or after September 9, 2011. The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection shall include all test results and dates of those tests.
 - (b). If the animal originates from a state or zone that is classified as Modified Advanced Accredited (MAA) or Modified Accredited (MA), the animal shall originate from a herd which was negative on a whole herd test (all animals 12 months of age and older shall be tested) within the 12 months prior to the date of sale, and the individual animal to be sold (all ages) must be test negative at least 60 days after the whole herd test and on or after September 9, 2011. The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection shall include all test results and dates of those tests.
4. **Brucellosis Testing Requirements:** All sale cattle shall be negative on an individual animal test for brucellosis on or after September 9, 2011. The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection shall include all test results and dates of those tests.
5. **Special Rules:** Special rules may apply in certain states that require a negative test for other diseases within 30 days of entry into the state. Check with the state of destination.
6. **Vaccination Recommendations:** It is highly recommended that all animals entering the show be immunized against IBR, PI3, BVD, BRSV, and rabies.

VETERINARIAN'S CHECKLIST - SALE CATTLE

- The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection must be signed, dated and issued by an accredited veterinarian on or after September 9, 2011.
- VACCINATION RECOMMENDATION - It is highly recommended that all animals entering the show be immunized against IBR, PI3, BVD, BRSV and rabies. It is strongly recommended that at least one vaccination against IBR, PI3, BVD, BRSV and rabies be given after January 1, 2011.**
- TUBERCULOSIS REQUIREMENTS**
 - (a). All sale cattle shall be negative on an individual animal test for tuberculosis on or after September 9, 2011). The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection shall include all test results and dates of those tests.

- BRUCELLOSIS REQUIREMENTS** - All sale cattle shall be negative on an individual animal test for brucellosis on or after September 9, 2011. The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection shall include all test results and dates of those tests.

VETERINARIAN'S CHECKLIST - Pennsylvania Cattle

The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection shall include all test results and dates of those tests.
- ❑ **BRUCELLOSIS REQUIREMENTS**
 - (a). Test-eligible animals shall be all unvaccinated cattle over eight months of age and calfhood vaccinated animals over 14 months of age. Steers are exempt from brucellosis testing requirements.
 - (b). If the animal originates from a Brucellosis-free state, no brucellosis test is required.
 - (c). If the animal originates from a Brucellosis Class A, B or C state the animal shall be brucellosis test negative within the 60 days prior to the date of arrival at the show.

SPECIAL RULES FOR BREEDING CATTLE

1. In addition to these Special Rules, this department is subject to the General Rules and Regulations as stated in this Premium List, pages 9-13.
2. **OWNERSHIP** – Cattle must be owned by the exhibitor listed on the entry at time of entry and at the time of show.
3. **REGISTRATION** – “All breeding cattle must be registered with their respective breed association. All animals must be properly tattooed and will be inspected at the show. Tattoos must be legible and must properly match the registration certificate. Absent, unreadable, or mismatched tattoos will result in disqualification from showing”. (see rule 23, page 12)
4. **NUMBER EXHIBITED** – A breed must have fifteen (15) head exhibited (15 legal entries must enter ring) by three (3) or more exhibitors in two (2) consecutive years or that breed will be dropped from competition at KEYSTONE INTERNATIONAL LIVESTOCK EXPOSITION.
5. **HEALTH RULES AND REGULATIONS** – All cattle must comply with the Health Rules as stated on pages 44-47
6. **ENTRY FEE** – PLA Members \$35 per head (\$25.00 + \$10.00 bedding fee), Non-Members \$55 per head (\$45.00 + \$10.00 bedding fee). (see Rule 11, Page 10). Entries postmarked September 1 through September 14, inclusive, will be accepted at \$70 per head for PLA Members and at \$110 per head for Non-Members. Entries postmarked September 15 – 21, inclusive, will be accepted at \$105 per head for PLA Members and \$165 per head for Non-Members. Group class entry fees are \$0.00. Payment must be received at the time of entry to be accepted.

IMORTANT! Texas Longhorns add \$5.00 per head recording fee.

7. Premiums will be paid in the open breeding cattle individual, group and cow-calf classes according to the tables listed below. **ALL PREMIUMS ARE SUBJECT TO CHANGE BY SHOW MANAGEMENT DEPENDENT UPON FUNDING SUPPORT.**
8. **GROUP CLASS ELIGIBILITY** – Animals shown in group classes must have been entered and shown in one of the classes for single animals.
 9. **SUBSTITUTIONS** – Substitutions within breed will be permitted and if made, must be filed with the department superintendent no later than the time animals are checked in the EXPOSITION by the breed clerks. Substitutions must be by the same owner and the owner’s name written exactly the same way.
 10. **ARRIVAL TIME** – Barns will be open at 6 p.m. Monday, October 3. Open show Maine-Anjou & MaineTainers must be in the barn by Wednesday, October 6, 2011 at 12:00 Noon ready for check-in. Open show Angus, Hereford, Simmental and SimAngus/SimSolutions cattle must arrive and be in the barns ready for check-in by 8:00 a.m. Thursday, October 6, 2011. All other open show cattle must be stalled in the barn by 12:00 Noon Thursday, October 6, to be eligible to compete at KILE. No animals may be unloaded between 11:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m.

11. Stabling requests must be made at the time of entry or stabling will be solely at the discretion of the beef cattle committee. Stabling assignments will be complete by Wednesday, September 28, 2011 and posted by Monday, October 3, 2011.

- 12. TIE OUT TIME** – Cattle may be taken to tie out area at 6:00 p.m. but MUST be in the barn by 8:00 a.m.
All cattle will utilize the tie outs.
- 13. TRAILERS – New Rule:** ALL TRAILERS may be parked on-site as space permits. Off-site trailer parking is encouraged. Please see the map on page 171 for directions.
- 14. NURSE COWS** – All animals shown in individual classes must be weaned, with the exception of the calf in the cow/calf class pair. Nurse cows are not permitted, except when a cow is a member of a cow/calf pair.
- 15. MUZZLES** – No animal may be muzzled at anytime during the EXPOSITION.

16. A committee, representing show management, will observe the handling of all animals both in and out of show ring and will have the authority to disqualify any exhibitor for unethical practices.

- 17. RELEASE TIME** – Will be at the conclusion of the Supreme Champion Beef Pageant, Sunday, October 9. Breeds that do not have a junior show on Sunday, October 9 (White Park, Highland and Texas Longhorn) may release from 6 pm Saturday, October 8 to 6 am Sunday, October 9. After 6 am Sunday, October 9 all remaining White Park, Highland & Texas Longhorn exhibitors must release after Supreme Champion. ANY EXHIBITOR REMOVING ANY OF THEIR ANIMALS FROM THE BARNs BEFORE RELEASE TIME WILL FORFEIT ALL THEIR PREMIUM MONEY.
- 18.** Large classes in each breed may be split into more than one class at the discretion of the show committee.
- 19.** Angus Open Breeding Cattle individual class premiums will be paid according to the scale on page 56. Angus Group Class premiums will be paid according to the scale below.
- 20.** American British White Park, Hereford, Highland, Limousin, Maine-Anjou, MaineTainer, Shorthorn, Simmental, Red Angus, and Texas Longhorn Open Breeding Cattle will be paid according to the following scale:

All rules of the Keystone International Livestock Exposition apply in addition to those listed below.

SPECIAL RULES

Show Ring Condition – All cattle must be displayed clean, neat, well groomed, fitted, well fed, trimmed and in a healthy condition.

Exhibitor Appearance – All exhibitors are to be neatly dressed and wear dark colored slacks/jeans (preferably black), dark button shirts with collars (preferably black) or white button shirts with collars and appropriate boots or shoes (no tennis shoes).

Registration - All cattle must be registered with either the American British White Park Association (APWPA) or the British White Cattle Association of America. All cattle must be purebred as defined by the ABWPA which is 15/16 or higher for bulls and 7/8 or higher for females.

FEMALES

71. **SPRING HEIFER CALVES**, calved on or after March 1, 2011
72. **JUNIOR HEIFER CALVES**, calved between January – February 2011
73. **WINTER HEIFER CALVES**, calved between November – December 2010
74. **SENIOR HEIFER CALVES**, calved between September – October 2010
75. **SUMMER YEARLING HEIFERS**, calved between May – August 2010
76. **SPRING YEARLING HEIFERS**, calved between March – April 2010

SPECIAL RULES

Exhibitors must have the original registration certificate on each animal available for inspection at the show. **Electronically stored registration certificates are NOT accepted - only the original certificates issued by the American Angus Association.** Any animal, upon check-in, which does not have a legible permanent identification mark (ear tattoo marks, freeze-branded marks or hot-branded marks) corresponding to the permanent identification mark on the registration certificate, is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible permanent identification mark, animals cannot be re-tattooed and rechecked at the show.

Any female shown with a calf at side: the calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf, and the calf must be registered by show day and have the original registration certificate at check in.

Only one person at a time shall lead an animal into the show ring.

Exhibitors who participate in shows that accept premium monies contributed by the American Angus Association are subject to the Association Rules as found in the Breeders Reference Guide of the Association. These rules are found in Part 2; Association Rules. The rules relating directly with the exhibition of Angus cattle are Part 2: Association Rules; Rule 800 Series; including Rule 800 - 810. These rules can be found at www.angus.org.

Altering the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the covering of white skin, false tail heads (or use of any false hair), with the exception of false tail switches. The use of graphite, powders, hemp or other similar substances used externally are also prohibited. Other prohibited products include those used internally such as steroids, illegal or unlicensed pharmaceuticals or artificial filling. Any animal found to be in violation will be barred from showing.

At any show for which the American Angus Association appropriates funds toward the payment of premiums, no exhibitors, individuals assisting exhibitors or member owners at such show shall be allowed to use any coloring agents, on any animal exhibited. The Association may adopt and implement various tests designed to monitor this prohibition, including but not limited to a "white towel" or "white glove" test. No aerosol cans or other pressurized containers will be allowed in designated line up areas.

All animals exhibited are subject to DNA marker or blood type test to verify accuracy of parentage as covered under the Association Rules and for other testing as required by the individual show.

Authorized representatives of the Association have the authority to enforce the rules set forth herein as well as in the Association Rules, including the barring of a registered animal from a livestock show at which it is to be shown, if there are reasonable grounds to believe a violation has occurred..

Any female that qualifies for female classes in the Association's standard classifications are not eligible to show in the cow/calf classes. However, the calf at the side of the female is eligible to show in its respective class. Grand Champion & Reserve Grand Champion Cow/Calf pairs do not show for Grand Champion female and are ineligible to compete in the get of sire, junior get-of-sire and Breeders Six Head.

SPECIAL RULES

All animals to be eligible for an Open Charolais Breeding Class must be purebred and registered with the American International Charolais Association (AICA). Only bona fide (original) certificates of registration will be accepted as evidence of registration and ownership; NO PHOTOCOPIES.

An animal is eligible to enter or compete in an open Charolais breeding class if registered in country of origin outside the United States and is eligible for purebred registry in the AICA Herdbook.

Animals registered in the AICA Colored Division Registry (QF and QM initialed registration numbers) must meet the perimeters of the AICA Color Card.

All animals to be eligible may be approved by a sifting committee designated by the AICA. Stall space will not be provided for any Charolais cattle that have not been accepted by the sifting committee.

All animals are subject to a medical examination in order to determine age, and each animal will be present in the show ring in its natural conformation without alteration or modification. Use of artificial tailheads is not permitted.

Any animal not having a legible tattoo or firebrand number is ineligible and will be barred from showing.

Bulls from classes 937, 938, 941, 942, and 943 must have a valid, satisfactory semen test certificate in possession. This certificate is valid for the entire show season.

All animals shown in individual classes must be weaned, with the exception of the Cow-Calf class and calves at the side of females calved after September 1, 2009. Calves at side must be purebred and registered with the AICA. Females calved after September 1, 2009, must show in individual female class appropriate to age. Nurse cows are not permitted.

All females 20 months and older exhibited at AICA sanctioned shows must be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy from a licensed veterinarian or have produced fertile eggs as certified in a written statement by a licensed veterinarian or embryologist or have a calf at side.

AICA requires that all animals be shown with a halter and suggest that all bulls be shown with a nose lead.

ALL EXHIBITS OF CHAROLAIS BREEDING CATTLE SHALL BE GOVERNED BY THE AICA RULES AND REGULATIONS, ARTICLE XV, TITLED EXHIBITION OF ANIMALS. THE INSPECTION OF EXHIBIT CATTLE IS SPECIFIED IN ARTICLE XV, PARAGRAPH C, OF THE ASSOCIATION RULES AND REGULATIONS AND NON-COMPLIANCE OF EXHIBIT INSPECTION IS SPECIFIED IN PARAGRAPH D OF THE SAME ARTICLE XV.

ARTICLE XV, PARAGRAPH B, POINT 2: "Each animal will be presented in its natural conformation and structure without alteration or modification. Alteration or modification shall be defined to include any surgical, chemical, electrical or other (including banding or other circulatory construction) appearance change for cosmetic purpose, save only branding, tattooing, foot trimming or dehorning. The act of artificially filling animals internally, which would include stomach pumping, drench tubes, or any other method per os (by esophagus), is prohibited. Silicone injection or other injection for cosmetic purpose shall be prohibited. Anabolic steroid use shall likewise be prohibited and any animal testing positive for anabolic steroid or diuretic use shall be presumed to be altered and modified."

Effective October 22, 2004, at any American-International Charolais Association (AICA) sanctioned show (including shows receiving AICA premium funding and/or qualifying as Roll of Excellence Show), the use of a coloring agent, flock and powder

is prohibited. Use of these products will result in the immediate disqualification of a given animal at such show.

INFORMATION & RULES

1. All exhibitors must be members of the Mid-Atlantic Highland Cattle Association (MAHA).
2. All animals (except steers & spayed heifers) must be currently registered or awaiting the acquisition of registration papers the American Highland Cattle Association prior to the participation in an American Highland Cattle Association Roll of Excellence Show.
3. Exhibitors are required to post a 10" x 12" card over each animal stating; Name, Registration Number, Birthdate, Sire & Dam (optional).
4. Exhibitor's number must be worn on their back while showing. Show attire is a white shirt and dark pants or a kilt. Attire with farm name/logo prohibited in showing.
5. Exhibitors are encouraged to use farm signs.
6. All cattle must be tied with a neck rope in addition to a regular halter.
7. The exhibitors are responsible for the health of their animals. IMPORTANT – The Show Committee has the right to call for the services of a veterinarian for the treatment of an animal that is sick or injured if the exhibitor is not available. The fee must be paid by the exhibitor prior to the release of the animal by the Show Committee.
8. Any animal deemed uncontrollable by the Ring Steward will be excused from the showing.
9. Rule violations will be handled by the Show Committee.
10. Artificially altering the natural conformation or structure of an animal is strictly prohibited for this event. In addition the use of growth hormones is forbidden. Every exhibitor also agrees to submit any entries to any inspection deemed necessary by the Show Committee.
11. Bulls born before October 1, 2009 must be shown with rings or nose leads.
12. Steer Class – Purebred Steers are not required to be registered. Crossbred Steers are required to be 50% Highland. Steers are not required to be shown with a ring or nose lead.
13. American Highland cattle Association Rules for sanctioned shows:
 - a. Exhibitors must be members in good standing of the American Highland Cattle Association or the Canadian Highland Cattle Society.

STANDARD RULES AND REGULATIONS

All animals must be registered with the North American Limousin Foundation (NALF). Embryo Transfer (ET) calves with pending registration must have parentage-verification paperwork in the NALF system. All animals must be 75% (3/4) Limousin (NALF percentage, not actual) or greater as indicated on orange NALF registration certificates or purple-papered Lim-Flex cattle as indicated by NALF registration certificates. Percentage, fullblood, purebred and Lim-Flex cattle shall compete in the same classes and championships.

If a show does not abide by the NALF MOE show rules exhibitors will not be awarded points for that show.

Animals must be properly tattooed and will be inspected at the show. Tattoos must be legible and must match the registration certificates. If an animal's tattoo is not legible and cannot be read upon initial processing, it will be ineligible to show and not be allowed to return with a new or corrected tattoo.

To maintain a high degree of confidence in Limousin shows, the North American Limousin Foundation reserves the right to disqualify any animal that has been fitted in an unethical manner. Unethical fitting shall include the following:

- a) any use of paints, hair coloring conditioners, colored show foam, graphite, colored powders or any other substances; all animals may be subject to white towel test;
- b) the addition of any hair or hair like substances, including false tailheads and false polls (false tail switches are allowed);
- c) the cutting, tearing or gluing of the hide or underneath the hide or removal of tissue in an attempt to alter the shape of the animal;
- d) any products, solutions, liquids administered internally or externally to alter the conformation of the animal is prohibited. This includes the use of steroids, growth stimulants, and the act of artificially filling animals internally, which would include stomach pumping, drench tubes, or any other method.

EXCEPTIONS: In the case of severely sick or severely dehydrated animals, the exhibitor may have fluids or electrolytes administered by the licensed official show veterinarian with the approval of the show superintendent and/or North American Limousin Foundation representative. This exception is not applicable on show day or weigh-in/check-in day.

Bulls older than one year of age must show with a nose-lead. The right to disqualify from the show any animal deemed unmanageable is reserved by the Limousin show superintendent and the show management.

Protests against exhibitors, individual animals, or fitting violations of show cattle must be submitted in writing and signed by five (5) active members of the North American Limousin Foundation and presented to the show superintendent within 12 hours after the completion of the show.

The North American Limousin Foundation reserves the right to mouth animals for dental development.

The North American Limousin Foundation reserves the right to collect hair samples from any animal.

All animals shown must be solid red or black above the flanks, excluding birthmarks.

Classes and championship breaks will be determined after all cattle have been checked in. No class shall contain more than 20 head or have an age spread of more than 60 days unless the animals are over two years old.

Calves exhibited along side dams in the cow/calf class are ineligible to

show as individuals.

In order to maintain a high degree of integrity and credibility in all Limousin shows, all owners and exhibitors will be expected to adhere to all North American Limousin Foundation rules and regulations regarding the exhibition of Limousin cattle. And, to adhere to the rules or regulations deemed suitable by the Keystone International Livestock Exposition.

PERFORMANCE REQUIREMENTS

To receive MOE points all cattle must have the following performance data submitted and on file at the North American Limousin Foundation: a. Birth Weight (bulls & heifers); b. Weaning weight (bulls & heifers); c. Yearling weight (bulls & heifers); d. Yearling scrotal circumference; Pregnancy test (females older than 600 days at seasons end); Breeding Soundness Exam and Semen Test (bulls older than 400 days). NOTE: All performance data must be submitted by December 1 to receive MOE points. Failure to have documentation on file at NALF by the deadline will result in disqualification from the MOE program and no points will be awarded. It is the responsibility of the breeder/owner/exhibitor to submit this information; NALF will not send any communication to breeder/owner/exhibitor requesting submission.

10. Heifers exhibited at 20 months of age or older must be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy. For heifers used in embryo transfer, a certificate of positive fertility issued by a licensed veterinarian must be available for inspection.
11. Bulls exhibited at 14 months of age or older must be accompanied by a positive semen test or a signed statement from a veterinarian verifying that the bull is known breeder.
12. Any and all cattle shall be made available to have blood drawn for parentage verification, detection of foreign substances or the presence of altering. If recorded parent is excluded as a result of the blood typing, the owner may at his or her expense, request the AMAA to determine the actual parent. Failure to determine parentage will result in disqualification of that animal from the AMAA herd book.

3. MaineTainer females must be 1/4 to 5/8 blood Maine-Anjou.
4. Tattoos will be checked, must be legible, and correspond exactly with the registration certificate. Other than brucellosis calfhood tattoo, there shall be no permanent identification marks other than those noted on the certificate of registry.
5. The attempted surgical or non-surgical alteration of conformation of an animal is prohibited, except for de-horning. Cattle must be shown in their natural condition.
6. The use of false tailheads or adding hair or other material to any part of the animal's body is prohibited.
7. The dyeing or artificial changing of the existing color pattern and color will be prohibited.
8. All animals over 7 months of age must be de-horned.
9. Bulls 10 months of age and older will be shown with a bull lead in place.
10. Heifers exhibited at 20 months of age or older must be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy. For heifers used in embryo transfer, a certificate of positive fertility issued by a licensed veterinarian must be available for inspection.
11. Bulls exhibited at 14 months of age or older must be accompanied by a positive semen test or a signed statement from a veterinarian verifying that the bull is known breeder.
12. Any and all cattle shall be made available to have blood drawn for parentage verification, detection of foreign substances or the presence of altering. If recorded parent is excluded as a result of the blood typing, the owner may at his or her expense, request the AMAA to determine the actual parent. Failure to determine parentage will result in disqualification of that animal from the AMAA herd book.

SHOW REGULATIONS AND CLASSIFICATIONS

1. GENERAL REGULATIONS

- a) Only registered Red Angus cattle in Category 1A (100%) and Category 1B (87% through 99%) will be eligible to show. This specifically excludes cattle in Category II and Category III. Under state supervision.
- b) All animals entered must conform to all show and Association eligibility requirements.
- c) Cattle entered in any Red Angus show must be officially registered in the appropriate Red Angus Association Herdbook. Exhibitors are subject to all rules, regulations and policies of the Red Angus Association of America.
- d) Entries in classes at any Red Angus show are accepted with the understanding that each exhibitor agrees to conform to the rules and regulations of the Red Angus Association of America with reference to inspection of entries, such as blood typing, mouthing and such other inspections prescribed by the Red Angus Association of America.
- e) Any animal entered in a Red Angus show found to have an illegible tattoo, improper or incorrect tattoo or no tattoo, or dental development in excess of allowable limits, will be disqualified for that and subsequent Red Angus shows. Reinstatement of animals thus disqualified can be authorized only by the Board of Directors or the Executive Committee of the Board of Directors of the Red Angus Association of America.
- f) Each exhibitor and /or owner of Red Angus cattle entered in any Red Angus show or exhibition is required to ensure that each animal will be exhibited in its natural conformation and structure and without any alterations or modifications, with the exception of acceptable fitting, grooming and treatment of hooves.
- g) Unacceptable modification, alteration, grooming, fitting or treatment of hooves will subject the individual animal to disqualification in the show.
- h) False tailheads shall be considered as a unethical practice and not be allowed in Red Angus competition. If such cases are discovered, the person (s) responsible shall be called to account for such actions by the RAAA Board of Directors.

2. OWNERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

- a) Each entry in a Red Angus show must be made in the name of the owner of record, appearing on the Registration Certificate.
- b) Partnership animals must be so registered and entered under the partnership designation.
- c) Exhibitors must have official Registration or Incomplete Registration Certificates on all entries available for inspection by show and/or Association officials. This may include officially produced copies of original Registration Certificates obtainable from the Red Angus Association National Office.
- d) Animals entered in any Red Angus show must have been registered in the name of the person entering said animal(s) not less than 30 days prior to the date of judging.
- e) Substitutions for animals already entered in a Red Angus show will be permitted up to and including seven days previous to the announced date of judging, providing such substitution(s) is/are permitted by the show management.

3. DECLARATION OF PARTICIPATION

Each exhibitor and/or owner of Red Angus entering in any Red Angus show or ex-

hibition is subject to the following “Declaration of Participation” in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the Red Angus Association of America.

I/We, as exhibitor and/or owner of Red Angus, having made entry application to any Red Angus show or exhibition, do hereby agree:

- a) To make our cattle available to any tests or examinations called for by designated representatives of the Red Angus Association of America or show officials with regard to acceptability of the cattle to be exhibited in the show.
- b) To absolve the Red Angus Association of America from claims for damages resulting from any such examinations or tests requested by designated representatives of the Association or show officials.
- c) To retain the right to challenge the results of any such examination or test in due course and under the provisions of the Right to Appeal, in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the Red Angus Association of America and incorporated in the SHOW REGULATIONS AND CLASSIFICATIONS.

4. PREMIUMS

Money or trophy awards for any Red Angus show will be funded through exhibitor entry fees and/or sources other than the Red Angus Association of America, unless otherwise provided by the local and/or national Red Angus Associations.

5. RIGHT TO APPEAL

- a) It is the explicit intent of the Red Angus Association of America to protect any and all exhibitors and/or owners of cattle entered in Red Angus shows from unethical and illegal standards; that the true course intended for the exhibition of Red Angus cattle is to show Red Angus cattle with desirable conformation and value as breeding cattle.
- b) It is also the explicit intent of the Red Angus Association of America that no exhibitor and/or owner of cattle entered in any Red Angus show be denied due process or appeal.
- c) Should any exhibitor and/or owner of cattle entered in any Red Angus show feel the need to dispute or challenge either: (a) the results of any examination or test administered to his/her animals as called for by any representative of the Red Angus Association or any show official, or (b) any decision made by any representative of the Red Angus Association or any show official as a result of any such examination or test, then the exhibitor has the right to make an appeal before the Executive Committee and/or the Board of Directors of the Red Angus Association of America. The exhibitor and/or owner is required to accept the decision of the Executive Committee and/or the Board of Directors of the Red Angus Association as final.

6. PROTESTS

- a) In the event of a protest, the individual making the protest will be required to make a deposit of \$100 to cover the cost of DNA or blood typing. If the protest is upheld, the deposit will be refunded.
- b) All major livestock shows and/or expositions have a provision for submitting “protest”. All exhibitors are urged to acquaint themselves with such provisions.
- c) In the event a complaint should arise relative to the conduct, entry or actual showing of an animal in any official Red Angus show under Red Angus Association sponsorship, such complaint must be set forth in writing and signed by the person initiating such complaint.
- d) Further, such complaint, properly executed, must be delivered to the Executive Secretary within 10 days following the completed judging of the show. The

Executive Secretary will present the formal complaint to the Board of Directors or the Executive Committee of the Board of Directors for their consideration and disposition.

7. BREEDING SHOW CLASSIFICATIONS

- a) Two systems of showing Red Angus are authorized; the “Futurity” system (classes determined after all entries arrive at the show) and the “Set-Age Class” system (specific classes are established according to set ages). The Set-Age system will be used at the 2011 Keystone International Livestock Exposition.
 - b) Only registered Red Angus (Category 1A and 1B) born on or after January 1, two years previous, will be eligible for the current show season. (The show season starts July 1, and concludes June 30 of the following year). Females over the maximum allowable age will be permitted in those shows where cow/calf classes are included.
 - c) Calf entries in the cow/calf classes may be shown individually providing individual entry has been made. Females in cow/calf class, if over maximum allowable age for individual class competition, are not eligible for such participation.
8. To correct the possibility of a tie for Premier Exhibitor Class, and/or Premier Breeder Class, where a tie exists through five placements, additional placements (beyond the stated 5 limitation) in the individual classes will be used, but only to point where the tie is broken.

- In order for an exhibitor to be eligible to receive the ASA share of premiums at Open and Junior PACE shows, the member must be in good standing, owner's entire herd must be enrolled in the WHR program by July 1 of the given year, and each animal shown must have individual SPR records in order to receive ASA financial support. The ASA portion of the show premiums will be given as a credit to the member account.
- No exhibitor shall be permitted to win more than two prizes in any one class.
- All animals must be registered as the property of the exhibitor in the records of the ASA by the time of the Fair or Show.
- Individual animals shown in all of the group classes listed below must have been entered and shown in one of the following classes for single animals. Multiple owned animals must be exhibited in the name of all owners.
- Family bred and raised animals entered by juniors in Junior Classes and subsequently entered in Open classes may be treated as family entries in group classes.

Senior/Junior Yearling Pregnancy Rule for exhibitors at all Open shows: Any senior/junior yearling female 28 months of age or older on or before the date of the PACE show must have a natural calf at side and must be shown with such. All females 20 months of age on or before the date of the PACE show must have a 60 day pregnancy verification signed by an accredited, non-owner veterinarian at the time the female is processed for the PACE show. Exhibitors may be asked to present said verification upon the request of the Show officials or ASA representatives. If verification cannot be produced, the female may be allowed to participate if the exhibitor can produce a qualified veterinarian to examine the female at the show site, and verify a 60-day pregnancy. Any infractions against this rule will lead to disqualification of that animal for that specific PACE show.

No cattle with pending registration will be accepted. Registrations other than ITLA will be charged an extra \$5.00 and this fee will be used to dual register, if so desired.

A calf shown with a cow shall not be older than 210 days of age. A calf shall be at least 180 days of age to show in individual class. Calf at side may show in only one class – as calf at side with dam or in an individual class. Calves shown at side must be haltered and led by an exhibitor.
