Open show Maine-Anjou and MaineTainer cattle must arrive and be in the barns ready for check-in by 12 Noon, Wednesday, October 5, 2011.

Open show Angus, Hereford, Simmental and SimAngus/SimSolutions cattle must arrive and be in the barns ready for check-in by 8:00 a.m., Thursday, October 6, 2011.

All other open show cattle must be stalled in the barn by 12:00 Noon, Thursday, October 7, 2011, to be eligible to compete at KILE.

HEALTH RULES FOR ALL CATTLE - HEALTH CERTIFICATION

HEALTH OF ANIMALS

No animal showing signs of infectious, contagious, or external parasitic disease will be allowed into the Pennsylvania Farm Show Complex & Expo Center. However, exhibitors who observe an animal that may present a health hazard to other animals are asked to report the stall location to the show committee. The official show veterinarian in consultation with Show Management shall be responsible for determining the health status of all animals. Animals showing evidence of infectious, contagious, or external parasitic diseases shall be removed by their owner from the show grounds at the direction of Show Management.

HEALTH CERTIFICATION DOCUMENTS

No animal will be allowed into the Pennsylvania Farm Show Complex & Expo Center unless they are accompanied by the required health certification documents. Additionally, the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection must be available for inspection upon request at all times while the animal is on the premises.

VETERINARIAN-CLIENT-PATIENT-RELATIONSHIP

By entry into the exposition you are confirming that you have established a Veterinarian-Client-Patient-Relationship for the animals you are entering and/or exhibiting. A Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship is a relationship in which the veterinarian has assumed the responsibility for making veterinary medical judgments regarding the health of the animal and the need for veterinary medical treatment and the owner or caretaker of the animal has agreed to follow the instructions of the veterinarian in relation to zoonotic diseases.

VACCINATION RECOMMENDATION

It is highly recommended that all animals entering the show be immunized against IBR, PI3, BVD, BRSV, and rabies. It is strongly recommended that at least one vaccination against IBR, PI3, BVD, BRSV, and rabies be given after January 1, 2011.

HEALTH RULES FOR PENNSYLVANIA EXHIBITION CATTLE

1. **Certificate of Veterinary Inspection:** Pennsylvania cattle must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection signed, dated and issued by an accredited veterinarian.

ian within the 30 days prior to the date of arrival at the show.

2. **Cattle Identification Requirements:** All cattle for exhibition must be identified by a USDA-issued metal eartag; a breed registration tattoo if the tattoo is legible; a breed registration eartag; or an ISO-compliant 15-digit eartag (including RFID).
3. No tuberculosis test is required.
4. No brucellosis test is required.
5. **Vaccination Recommendations:** It is highly recommended that all animals entering the show be immunized against IBR, PI3, BVD, BRSV, and rabies.

HEALTH RULES FOR OUT-OF-STATE EXHIBITION CATTLE

1. **Certificate of Veterinary Inspection:** Out-of-state cattle must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection signed, dated and issued by an accredited veterinarian within the 30 days prior to the date of arrival at the show. The accredited veterinarian must send a copy of the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection to the State Veterinarian of the state of origin for approval.
2. **Cattle Identification Requirements:** All cattle for exhibition must be identified by a USDA-issued metal eartag; a breed registration tattoo if the tattoo is legible; a breed registration eartag; or an ISO-compliant 15-digit eartag (including RFID).
3. **Tuberculosis Testing Requirements:**
 - (a). Test-eligible animals shall be all cattle of all ages.
 - (b). If the animal originates from a Tuberculosis-free state or zone, no tuberculosis test is required.
 - (c). If the animal originates from a state or zone that is classified as Modified Advanced Accredited (MAA), the animal shall be tuberculosis test negative within the 60 days prior to the date of arrival at the show. The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection shall include all test results and dates of those tests.
 - (d). If the animal originates from a state or zone that is classified as Modified Accredited (MA), the animal shall originate from a herd which was negative on a whole herd test (all animals 12 months of age and older shall be tested) within the 12 months prior to the date of arrival at the show, and the individual animal to be exhibited (all ages) must be test negative at least 60 days after the whole herd test and within the 60 days prior to the date of arrival at the show. The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection shall include all test results and dates of those tests.
4. **Brucellosis Testing Requirements:**
 - (a). Test-eligible animals shall be all unvaccinated cattle over eight months of age and calfhooed vaccinated animals over 14 months of age. Steers are exempt from brucellosis testing requirements.
 - (b). If the animal originates from a Brucellosis-free state, no brucellosis test is required.
 - (c). If the animal originates from a Brucellosis Class A, B or C state the animal shall be brucellosis test negative within the 60 days prior to the date of arrival at the show.
5. **Vaccination Recommendations:** It is highly recommended that all animals entering the show be immunized against IBR, PI3, BVD, BRSV, and rabies.

HEALTH RULES FOR SALE CATTLE

1. **Certificate of Veterinary Inspection:** Sale cattle must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection signed, dated and issued by an accredited veterinarian on or after September 9, 2011. The accredited veterinarian must send a copy of the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection to the State Veterinarian of the state of origin for

approval.

2. **Identification:** All cattle for sale must be identified by a USDA-issued metal eartag; a breed registration tattoo if the tattoo is legible; a breed registration eartag; or an ISO-compliant 15-digit eartag (including RFID).
3. **Tuberculosis Testing Requirements:**
 - (a). All sale cattle shall be negative on an individual animal test for tuberculosis on or after September 9, 2011. The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection shall include all test results and dates of those tests.
 - (b). If the animal originates from a state or zone that is classified as Modified Advanced Accredited (MAA) or Modified Accredited (MA), the animal shall originate from a herd which was negative on a whole herd test (all animals 12 months of age and older shall be tested) within the 12 months prior to the date of sale, and the individual animal to be sold (all ages) must be test negative at least 60 days after the whole herd test and on or after September 9, 2011. The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection shall include all test results and dates of those tests.
4. **Brucellosis Testing Requirements:** All sale cattle shall be negative on an individual animal test for brucellosis on or after September 9, 2011. The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection shall include all test results and dates of those tests.
5. **Special Rules:** Special rules may apply in certain states that require a negative test for other diseases within 30 days of entry into the state. Check with the state of destination.
6. **Vaccination Recommendations:** It is highly recommended that all animals entering the show be immunized against IBR, PI3, BVD, BRSV, and rabies.

VETERINARIAN'S CHECKLIST - SALE CATTLE

- The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection must be signed, dated and issued by an accredited veterinarian on or after September 9, 2011.
- VACCINATION RECOMMENDATION - It is highly recommended that all animals entering the show be immunized against IBR, PI3, BVD, BRSV and rabies. It is strongly recommended that at least one vaccination against IBR, PI3, BVD, BRSV and rabies be given after January 1, 2011.**
- TUBERCULOSIS REQUIREMENTS**
 - (a). All sale cattle shall be negative on an individual animal test for tuberculosis on or after September 9, 2011). The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection shall include all test results and dates of those tests.
 - (b). If the animal originates from a state or zone that is classified as Modified Advanced Accredited (MAA) or Modified Accredited (MA), the animal shall originate from a herd which was negative on a whole herd test (all animals 12 months of age and older shall be tested) within the 12 months prior to the date of sale, and the individual animal to be sold (all ages) must be test negative at least 60 days after the whole herd test and on or after September 9, 2011. The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection shall include all test results and dates of those tests.
- BRUCELLOSIS REQUIREMENTS** - All sale cattle shall be negative on an individual animal test for brucellosis on or after September 9, 2011. The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection shall include all test results and dates of those tests.
- SPECIAL RULE** - Special rules may apply in certain states that require a negative test for other diseases within 30 days of entry into the state. Check with the state of destination.

VETERINARIAN'S CHECKLIST - Pennsylvania Cattle

- ❑ The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection must be signed, dated and issued by an accredited veterinarian within the 30 days prior to the date of arrival at the show.
- ❑ **VACCINATION RECOMMENDATION - It is highly recommended that all animals entering the show be immunized against IBR, PI3, BVD, BRSV and rabies. It is strongly recommended that at least one vaccination against IBR, PI3, BVD, BRSV and rabies be given after January 1, 2011.**

VETERINARIAN'S CHECKLIST - Out-Of-State Cattle

- ❑ The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection must be signed, dated and issued by an accredited veterinarian within the 30 days prior to the date of arrival at the show.
- ❑ **VACCINATION RECOMMENDATION - It is highly recommended that all animals entering the show be immunized against IBR, PI3, BVD, BRSV and rabies. It is strongly recommended that at least one vaccination against IBR, PI3, BVD, BRSV and rabies be given after January 1, 2011.**
- ❑ **TUBERCULOSIS REQUIREMENTS**
 - (a). Test-eligible animals shall be all cattle of all ages.
 - (b). If the animal originates from a Tuberculosis-free state or zone, no tuberculosis test is required.
 - (c). If the animal originates from a state or zone that is classified as Modified Advanced Accredited (MAA), the animal shall be tuberculosis test negative within the 60 days prior to the date of arrival at the show. The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection shall include all test results and dates of those tests.
 - (d). If the animal originates from a state or zone that is classified as Modified Accredited (MA), the animal shall originate from a herd which was negative on a whole herd test (all animals 12 months of age and older shall be tested) within the 12 months prior to the date of arrival at the show, and the individual animal to be exhibited (all ages) must be test negative at least 60 days after the whole herd test and within the 60 days prior to the date of arrival at the show. The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection shall include all test results and dates of those tests.
- ❑ **BRUCELLOSIS REQUIREMENTS**
 - (a). Test-eligible animals shall be all unvaccinated cattle over eight months of age and calfhood vaccinated animals over 14 months of age. Steers are exempt from brucellosis testing requirements.
 - (b). If the animal originates from a Brucellosis-free state, no brucellosis test is required.
 - (c). If the animal originates from a Brucellosis Class A, B or C state the animal shall be brucellosis test negative within the 60 days prior to the date of arrival at the show.
