KEYSTONE HEIFER SHOWCASE SALE

1. Keystone Heifer Showcase Sale will be held 3 pm Saturday, October 8 in the Small Arena. Requirements for sale eligibility:

1. Consignors must be a member of their respective state breed association and must be a member of the Pennsylvania Livestock Association (PLA)
2. Any registered purebred or registered percentage heifer recognized by and registered with a Breed Association and with eligibility to be exhibited at KILE.
3. Entry must be received by KILE before September 1 (no exceptions). Heifers are eligible to show in the classes they are entered into as listed in premium list for the open shows.
4. Heifers must have a valid, current registration paper issued by breed association with ability to be transferred. The registration certificate must be presented at check-in. If a transferrable registration paper is not presented at time of check-in, heifers WILL NOT SELL.
5. Health charts must meet requirements for interstate shipment. Separate health chart for EACH individual heifer (can be a copy) must be presented at check-in.
6. Nonrefundable Nomination/Cataloging Fee of \$65 (plus \$35 entry fee, for a total of \$100) is due with entry and the \$65 will be credited to sale expenses upon settlement.
7. Pedigrees, footnotes and pictures (to be presented with entries) will be cataloged and published on KILE website, www.keystoneinternational.state.pa.us . Lot numbers will be assigned by breed and age. A final hard copy (pedigree and footnotes) will be available to be sent on request only.
8. Pictures will be posted on website (submitted in electronic format only) with footnotes if presented by consigner with entries. No pictures accepted after September 1.
9. KILE will handle all transfers.
10. A commission of 10% will be charged for catalog, website picture, auctioneer, ring men, clerks, advertising (with normal KILE advertising), health papers and handling transfers. Consigners will be charged for transfer costs assessed by breed associations in addition to commission.
11. Sale order will be determined by Keystone Heifer Showcase Sale Committee. Sale Committee has the right to reject any heifer of poor quality not suitable for sale.
12. Each Pennsylvania State breed association (or the association representing PA) represented in the sale with cattle will receive 1% of the gross revenue of their breeds' cattle. Consigners and breed associations are encouraged to promote the sale along with their cattle so as to benefit the KEYSTONE HEIFER SHOWCASE SALE. Each breed association with cattle entered into the sale will have a representative on the sale committee.

CLUB CALVES & PROSPECT HEIFERS

1. An auction sale of Club Calves & Prospect Heifers will be conducted Saturday, October 8, at 6:30 p.m. in the Small Arena.
2. All animals will be weighed for sale weights and must be properly conditioned as directed by the management.
3. Owners must provide the necessary attendants to conduct animals to and from weight scales and the sale ring.
4. All animals will be sold on a per head basis.
5. The sale of market animals will be on a cash basis and all buyers will be required to establish their financial responsibility before the opening of the sale.
6. A handling fee of 6% will be charged.
7. Livestock purchased becomes the immediate property of the successful bidder and subject to delivery at the close of the sale upon payment of the purchase price.
8. Sale proceeds will be mailed to the consignor in 10 days or less following the sale.

MARKET BARROWS

1. All barrows will be sold as arranged by management following the judging on Sunday, October 9.
2. Additional information is contained in the specific department and section related to barrows.
3. A reasonable handling fee will be charged.

SPECIAL RULES FOR SALE CLASSES

1. ELIGIBILITY-

- a. All ewes entered in the sale must show in their respective classes: Dorset-98, 101 or 103; Hampshire 128, 131, or 133; Montadale – 188, 191 or 193; Shropshire – 278, 281 or 283; Southdown – 308, 311 or 313; Suffolk – 338, 341 or 343; Tunis – 368, 371, or 373. They may also show in group and champion classes.
- b. All ewes shown must sell unless eliminated due to quality or health reasons. The judge will be asked to eliminate sheep that he feels are not sufficient quality to sell. The show veterinarian may also recommend withdrawal for health reasons.
- c. All yearling ewes, except those Dorsets which have lambs at side, will be sold as exposed. The consignor may elect to guarantee his ewe as bred at time of sale. If announced, this guarantee is made by the consignor and settlement must be made between him and the purchaser. The Exposition or Sale Manager will not accept responsibility in the guarantee.
- d. **HAMPSHIRE ONLY-** The Hampshire Sale Committee will individually inspect and approve each animal to be offered in the sale from a standpoint of soundness, proper breed type and purity.
- e. **SOUTHDOWN ONLY-** All sheep must be sheared one (1) week before showing.
- f. **SHROPSHIRE ONLY –** All Shropshire breeding sheep must be shorn completely to the hide within 5 days of the show date. The wool may be left from the rear hocks down and the front knees down plus the wool cap defined from the ears and poll forward.
- g. **MONTADALE ONLY-**No artificial coloring may be used.

2. ENTRIES-

- a. Entries must be made on a Keystone International Livestock Exposition entry blank. Contact the sale manager or KILE office for entry blanks.

MAIL ENTRIES TO THE SALE MANAGER ONLY.

- b. Must include (1) pedigree, (2) name and association number of ram to which ewe was bred or exposed, (3) date of breeding or period exposed to ram.
- c. Postmark of August 31, 2011 is deadline for entries.
- d. A sale charge of 10 percent will be made on all sheep sold.
- e. Substitution within reason or that which improves the quality of the sheep offered for sale will be accepted.
- f. Sale manager(s) will make/forward all sale entries to KILE with the proper entry fees.

3. **ENTRY FEE** - \$20 per head entry which will enter the ewe in both the sale and the KEYSTONE INTERNATIONAL LIVESTOCK EXPOSITION. The Sale Manager will make entry and pay entry fees for all sheep to the Exposition. DO NOT MAKE SEPARATE ENTRY TO THE EXPOSITION. There will be no refund.
4. **ENTRY LIMIT**- The first 25 entries received will be accepted with earliest post-mark date as priority. The sponsoring organization or the Sale Manager, however, has authority to limit, increase, or prorate the number of entries. A minimum of 10 head must be consigned in order to hold a sale. Contact sale manager to be sure the sale will be held.
5. **AWARDS**-
 - a. The Keystone International Livestock Exposition will present a special award to each of the seven Champion Sale Ewes.
 - b. The Pennsylvania Dorset Breeders Association will present a special award to the Reserve Champion Sale Ewe.
 - c. The Pennsylvania Suffolk Sheep Association will present a special plaque to the Reserve Champion Sale Ewe.
 - d. The Pennsylvania-Maryland Shropshire Breeder's Association will present a special award to the Reserve Champion Sale Ewe.

KEYSTONE CLASSIC ALL BREED SWINE SALE

Friday, October 7, 2011

6:00 p.m.

1. All breeds will be able to participate.
2. Exhibitors are not required to consign their animal to the sale.
3. Boars-Champion and Reserve Champions will be offered. If these are not selling, the next high placing animal will be offered: If the Champion and Reserve are from the same class, the other first place boar will be offered.
4. Gilts-Champion and Reserve Champion, plus all other 1st and 2nd place animals, will be offered. Any exhibitor not having a 1st or 2nd place gilt will be allowed to nominate 1 animal per breed to the sale.
5. The swine committee and judge will determine the sale order and the breed starting the auction. Management reserves the right to adjust the total number of animals to be sold.
6. If an exhibitor misses the sale order the animal will sell at the end of the sale.
7. A sale order sheet will be printed.
8. Sale Commission will be determined after the sale when expenses have been calculated.
9. A fee of \$10.00 per animal for “no sale” after going through the sale ring.
10. Exhibitors not paying their outstanding accounts for the sale will have their premium check held until all accounts are settled.
11. Individual health papers must be available for the veterinarian at the auction. Animal selling must be able to go into other states. Please check with your veterinarian to be sure you have the proper health papers.
12. Duplicate copies of registration papers, NO originals, must be available for the auction.
13. The committee will be transferring all of the hogs to the new owner. The consignor will pay the breed transfer costs plus a \$5.00 per head administrative fee.
14. Consigners must be at their sale animal’s pen after they are sold to verify the paperwork of the buyer and assist with loading.
15. Paint numbers will be available for each exhibitor to number their own animals.
