**SPECIAL RULES FOR BREEDING SHEEP**

1. In addition to these Special Rules, this department is subject to the General Rules and Regulations as stated in this Premium List, pages 9-13.
2. **HEALTH RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR SHEEP** – The Pennsylvania Bureau of Animal Health & Diagnostics Services will pass upon the health status of all entries upon arrival. Those not qualifying will not be admitted. To qualify, all animals must be free of any evidence of transmissible disease, including external parasites, sore mouth, and foot rot, and be clearly identified on Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (Health Certificate) of the state of origin.
  - (a). **Certificate of Veterinary Inspection:** All sheep to be exhibited must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection signed, dated and issued by an accredited veterinarian. The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection must be issued within the 30 days prior to the date of arrival at the show. For out-of-state sheep, the accredited veterinarian must send a copy of the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection to the State Veterinarian of the state of origin for approval.
  - (b). **Sheep Identification Requirements:** All sheep for exhibition must be identified by an official USDA scrapie eartag; a USDA-approved scrapie tattoo in addition to individual ID; a USDA-approved custom scrapie eartag; or an ISO-compliant 15-digit eartag (including RFID). The animal ID must be included on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.
  - (c). **Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship:** By entry into the exposition you are confirming that you have established a Veterinarian-Client-Patient-Relationship for the animals you are entering and/or exhibiting. A Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship is a relationship in which the veterinarian has assumed the responsibility for making veterinary medical judgments regarding the health of the animal and the need for veterinary medical treatment and the owner or caretaker of the animal has agreed to follow the instructions of the veterinarian in relation to zoonotic diseases.

**VETERINARIAN'S CHECKLIST**

- The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection must be signed, dated and issued within the 30 days prior to the date of arrival at the show.

**VETERINARIAN'S CHECKLIST SALE SHEEP**

- The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection must be signed, dated and issued on or after September 9, 2011.

3. **OWNERSHIP** - Animals must be the bona fide property of and owned by the exhibitor as recorded on the registration certificate. This name must appear on entry form.
4. **REGISTRATION**- All animals, regardless of age must be registered in their respective breed associations, and must bear breeders and association tags. Purchased

animals must have transfer recorded by the breed association at least thirty (30) days before the Exposition. There will be no exception to this rule.

Recognized breed associations are the American Cheviot Society; Columbia Sheep Breeders Association of America; American Corriedale Association; Continental Dorset Club; American Hampshire Sheep Association; American Oxford Association; American Shropshire Registry Association; American Southdown Breeders Association; United Suffolk Sheep Association; American and Delaine-Merino Record Association; American Rambouillet Sheep Breeders Association; Montadale Sheep Breeders Association, Inc.; National Tunis Sheep Registry, Inc.; Canadian Records and the Flock Book of Great Britain and Natural Colored Wool Growers Association.

5. **ENTRY FEE-** PLA Member \$25.00 per pen. Non-Member - \$50.00 (see rule 11, page 10). Pens are 6' x 8'. No entry fee on group classes but each animal in the group must be entered in its individual class.

**NOTE: Send sale ewe entries to the sale chairman only. Entries sent to the KILE office will not be accepted. Entry fee is \$20 per head payable by CHECK ONLY to sale Chairman. No online sale registrations permitted, and no credit card payments will be accepted for sale entries.**

6. **PREMIUMS** are subject to change by show management dependent upon funding support.
7. **ENTRY LIMITS-** Each exhibitor is limited to two entries per class, except group classes, one entry per class. Sale entries – No Limit on number of entries.
8. **NUMBER EXHIBITED-** A breed must have fifteen (15) head exhibited (15 legal entries must enter ring) by three (3) or more exhibitors in two (2) consecutive years or that breed will be dropped from competition at Keystone International Livestock Exposition.
9. **AGES-** The date for computing ages on all sheep shall be September 1 and January 1.
  - Teeth requirements are:
    - +Spring Lambs-must have all lamb teeth.
    - +Fall Lambs-yearling teeth may be present.
    - +Yearlings-may not have more than 4 permanent teeth showing at time of show.
10. **CLASSIFICATION-** Sheep must show in their appropriate class according to the birthdate on their registration paper except, when an animal must move to the next older class because of Rule 9 (teeth requirement).
11. **SUBSTITUTION-** Substitutions within breed and within sex will be permitted, and if made, must be filed with the superintendent no later than the time the animals are checked into the EXPOSITION by the breed clerks.
12. **NEW RULE – ARRIVAL TIME** - The barn will be open for sheep at 12:00 Noon, Monday, October 3. Breeding Sheep must be in the pens by 6:00 p.m., Wednesday October 5. **No Late Arrivals Accepted!** (Animals showing in the Jr. Show **ONLY** must arrive by 8:00 a.m., Saturday, October 8.)
13. **NEW RULE – TRAILER PARKING** - All trailers may be parked on-site beginning 12:00 Noon, September 30, 2011 as space permits. Off-site trailer parking is encouraged.

See the map on page 171 for parking directions.

14. **PENS-** Pens will be assigned. Exhibitors will be penned together if possible when the request is submitted. No extra pens will be assigned solely based on sale animals.
15. **BEDDING-** Straw, ground corncobs and shavings are the only bedding materials permitted to be used by sheep exhibitors. Initial bedding will not be provided. It must be furnished by the exhibitor. Straw and shavings will be available for purchase at the feed room. Ground corncobs will not be available in the feed room.
16. **NEW RULE – CHECKING ENTRIES-**All entries must be checked with certificate of registration by 10:00 a.m., Thursday, October 6. **Columbia, Corriedale, Merino, Natural Colored, Rambouillet, Oxford, Shropshire & Southdown must be checked with certificate of registration by 9:00 p.m. Wednesday, October 5. All other animals must be checked-in by 10 am Thursday, October 6.** Clerks will be in the Show Ring for this checking. Animals not checked in by 10:00 a.m. Thursday, September 30, will not be permitted to show.
17. **GROOMING –** Use only grooming products that are approved for use on meat producing animals when fitting any animal for show. Unapproved products may contain ingredients that result in unacceptable residues in the meat. If it is not certain that a products is residue safe and approved for use on meat animals, do not use it! **\*\*Important\*\*!** If upon slaughter, treatment with drugs, biologics, or any chemical from fitting products, is the cause of condemnation of a carcass, the loss of the carcass and any other damages will be borne by the exhibitor.
18. **SHEARING – SOUTHDOWN ONLY-** All Southdown breeding sheep must be sheared within ten (10) days of showing.
19. **STRUCTURES –** No tents, canopies, or similar structures may be erected in the sheep barn.
20. A committee, representing show management will observe the handling of all animals, both in and out of the show ring and will have the authority to disqualify any exhibitor for unethical practices.
21. **SHOWING –**
  - a. Only one person may be in the ring to show each animal. One additional person may be in the ring to set the animal's legs **ONLY**.
  - b. There will be a 7 minute maximum gate call between classes.
22. **CLASSES –** Show Management reserves the right to split classes.
23. **CHAMPIONS-** Champion classes are limited to first place animals. Second place sheep to the champion may compete for Reserve Champion Award.
24. **EXHIBITOR'S FLOCK** must be composed of: Ram, any age; two yearling ewes; two ewe lambs.
25. **PREMIER EXHIBITOR SPECIAL AWARD-** Will be awarded in each breed to the exhibitor accumulating the most points in individual and group classes. Championship classes not included. All animals will be placed and points awarded in reverse order of placing. Maximum of two sale animals to be included. The highest placing flock will determine the winner in the event of a tie.
26. **PREMIER BREEDER SPECIAL AWARD -** Will be awarded in each breed to the exhibitor accumulating the most points in individual classes on animals bred and

owned by the exhibitor. Championship and group classes not included. Maximum of two sale animals to be included. The least number of sheep shown by the breeder will determine the winner in the event of a tie.

27. **RELEASE TIME**- All sheep will be released from the barn at the conclusion of the Junior Show, SUNDAY, OCTOBER 3 and/or at the discretion of the sheep committee. ***ANY EXHIBITOR REMOVING ANY OF THEIR ANIMALS FROM THE BARN BEFORE RELEASE TIME WILL FORFEIT ALL THEIR PREMIUM MONEY AND MAY BE SUBJECT TO REJECTION OF ALL ENTRIES THE FOLLOWING YEAR.***

**EXHIBITOR'S MEETING** - Exhibitors are encouraged to meet with a representative of show management in the show ring immediately following the conclusion of judging on Sunday, October 9. Comments and suggestions are welcome at that time.
