SPECIAL RULES FOR JUNIOR BARROWS

1. In addition to these Special Rules, this department is subject to the General Rules and Regulations as stated in this Premium List, pages 9-13.

IMPORTANT:

ALL MARKET SWINE EXHIBITORS (OPEN BARROWS, JUNIOR BARROWS AND TRUCKLOADS) MUST HAVE A CURRENT AND VALID PORK QUALITY ASSURANCE (PQA) PLUS CERTIFICATE OR CARD AT THE TIME OF ENTRY.

A COPY MUST BE SENT TO THE KILE SHOW OFFICE AT THE TIME OF ENTRY.

ENTRIES FAILING TO INCLUDE A COPY OF A VALID PQA PLUS CARD BY THE ENTRY DEADLINE WILL BE REJECTED. ALL EXHIBITORS OF MARKET SWINE (OPEN BARROWS, JUNIOR BARROWS AND TRUCKLOADS) MUST BE PRE-APPROVED (IN THIS MANNER) IN ORDER TO EXHIBIT MARKET SWINE AT KILE AND TO HAVE THEIR MARKET SWINE HARVESTED AT HATFIELD QUALITY MEATS, INC. THERE ARE NO EXCEPTIONS!

2. Entries must comply with all rules of Open Barrows, Dept. 10, page 147-150 except for rules 2, 3b, 3d, and 3e.
3. **ENTRY FEE-** \$14.00 per pen. **NEW RULE:** minimum of 2 and a maximum of 5 animals allowed per pen. Pens also used for Open Show animals, must pay open show fees in addition to barrow show fees. ALL Exhibitors must purchase a minimum of one pen per each show entered.

4. **All premiums are subject to change by show management dependent upon funding support.**

5. **ENTRY LIMIT-** Each exhibitor is limited to three (3) entries.
6. **EXHIBITOR ELIGIBILITY-**
 - a. Entry must be in one name only.
 - b. Youth must be less than 21 years old on the day of the show.
7. **RESPONSIBILITY FOR ENTRIES-** The exhibitor is responsible for making proper entries and the certification of project animals. Entry fees of ineligible animals and entry fees of animals which do not appear at the EXPOSITION will be forfeited.
8. **BEDDING-** Straw and ground corncobs are the only bedding materials permitted. A deduction in premiums will be made for use of other materials. Initial bedding

will not be provided. It must be furnished by the exhibitor or purchased at the feed room.

- 9. **TRAILERS – NEW RULE:** All trailers may be parked on-site. Off-site trailer parking is encouraged. **See map on page 171.**
- 10. A committee, representing show management will observe the handling of all animals, both in and out of show ring and will have the authority to disqualify any exhibitor for unethical practices

11. Grooming - No dressing other than water may be used on the animals.

IMPORTANT!

If upon slaughter, treatment with drugs, biologics, or **any chemical from fitting products**, is the cause of condemnation of a carcass, the loss of the carcass and any other damages will be borne by the exhibitor. Animals consigned for slaughter during or immediately following the show shall not receive any treatment with drugs or biologics within the withdrawal time prior to slaughter. Withdrawal times for drugs and biologics are all stated on the directions for use. Label directions must be followed at all times. A Drug Certification and Disclosure Statement must be submitted at weigh-in. **Hair must be a minimum of one half inch in length.**

- 12. **SHOWING-** All Junior barrows must be shown by their owners. Parents will not be allowed to assist the boys or girls in the show ring.
- 13. **SUPERVISION-** All Junior exhibitors must be under the supervision of the parent or another qualified adult who is responsible for housing arrangements, conduct and general well being of the exhibitor.
- 14. **SLAUGHTERING-** The top barrows in each class will be slaughtered and entered in the KILE Score classes. All market swine, except underweight hogs, must be sold directly to slaughter to packer as arranged by management.
- 15. **JUNIOR CHAMPION BARROW ON-FOOT-** will compete on Sunday, October 9, for Grand Champion Barrow On-Foot.
- 16. **JUNIOR CHAMPION BARROW KILE SCORE-** will compete for Grand Champion KILE Score.
