1. All breeds will be able to participate.
2. Exhibitors are not required to consign their animal to the sale.
3. Boars-Champion and Reserve Champions will be offered. If these are not selling, the next high placing animal will be offered: If the Champion and Reserve are from the same class, the other first place boar will be offered.
4. Gilts-Champion and Reserve Champion, plus all other 1st and 2nd place animals, will be offered. Any exhibitor not having a 1st or 2nd place gilt will be allowed to nominate 1 animal per breed to the sale.
5. The swine committee and judge will determine the sale order and the breed starting the auction. Management reserves the right to adjust the total number of animals to be sold.
6. If an exhibitor misses the sale order the animal will sell at the end of the sale.
7. A sale order sheet will be printed.
8. Sale Commission will be determined after the sale when expenses have been calculated.
9. A fee of \$10.00 per animal for “no sale” after going through the sale ring.
10. Exhibitors not paying their outstanding accounts for the sale will have their premium check held until all accounts are settled.
11. Individual health papers must be available for the veterinarian at the auction. Animal selling must be able to go into other states. Please check with your veterinarian to be sure you have the proper health papers.
12. Duplicate copies of registration papers, NO originals, must be available for the auction.
13. The committee will be transferring all of the hogs to the new owner. The consignor will pay the breed transfer costs plus a \$5.00 per head administrative fee.
14. Consigners must be at their sale animal’s pen after they are sold to verify the paperwork of the buyer and assist with loading.
15. Paint numbers will be available for each exhibitor to number their own animals.

SPECIAL RULES FOR BREEDING SWINE

1. In addition to these Special Rules, this department is subject to the General Rules and Regulations as stated in this Premium List, pages 9-13.

Important! See Veterinarians Checklist on page 140.

2. HEALTH RULES AND REGULATIONS - SWINE

The Pennsylvania Bureau of Animal Health and Diagnostics Services will pass upon the health status of all entries upon arrival. Those not qualifying will not be admitted. To qualify, all animals must be free of any evidence of infectious, contagious, or parasitic diseases, and be clearly identified on a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (Health Certificate) of the state of origin signed, dated and issued by an accredited veterinarian on or after September 8, 2011. A copy of the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection must accompany the swine to the EXPOSITION and be available for inspection at all times as additional inspections of swine Certificate of Veterinary Inspection will be made.

HEALTH RULES FOR SWINE

1. **Certificate of Veterinary Inspection:** All swine must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection signed, dated and issued by an accredited veterinarian. The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection must be issued on or after September 8, 2011. For out-of-state swine, the accredited veterinarian must send a copy of the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection to the State Veterinarian of the state of origin for approval.
2. **Swine Identification Requirements:** All swine must be officially identified with one of the following: A legible herd tattoo in combination with an ear notch; a state issued metal eartag; or an ISO-compliant 15-digit tag (including RFID). The show veterinarian is not required to issue a CVI for animals that do not have legible identification at the time of sale.
3. **Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship:** By entry into the exposition you are confirming that you have established a Veterinarian-Client-Patient-Relationship for the animals you are entering and/or exhibiting. A Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship is a relationship in which the veterinarian has assumed the responsibility for making veterinary medical judgments regarding the health of the animal and the need for veterinary medical treatment and the owner or caretaker of the animal has agreed to follow the instructions of the veterinarian in relation to zoonotic diseases.
4. **Brucellosis and Pseudorabies Testing Requirements for Breeding Swine:**
 - (a). **Brucellosis:** All breeding swine must have had a negative brucellosis test on or after September 8, 2011, or must originate from a Validated Brucellosis Free Swine Herd, and the herd number, test results, and date of the last herd test shall be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

- (b). **Pseudorabies:** All breeding swine must have had a negative pseudorabies test on or after September 8, 2011, or must originate from a Qualified Pseudorabies Negative Swine Herd, and the herd number, test results, and date of the last herd test shall be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.
5. **Brucellosis and Pseudorabies Testing Requirements for Market Swine:**
- (a). **Brucellosis:** No brucellosis test is required for market swine sold for immediate slaughter.
 - (b). **Pseudorabies:** All market swine must have had a negative pseudorabies test on or after September 8, 2011; or must originate from a Qualified Pseudorabies Negative Swine Herd, and the herd number, test results, and date of the last herd test shall be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

VETERINARIAN'S CHECKLIST

- Certificate of Veterinary Inspection must be signed, dated and issued by an accredited veterinarian on or after September 8, 2011.

BREEDING SWINE

- BRUCELLOSIS REQUIREMENTS**

All breeding swine must have had a negative brucellosis test on or after September 8, 2011, or must originate from a Validated Brucellosis Free Swine Herd, and the herd number, test results, and date of the last herd test shall be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

- PSEUDORABIES REQUIREMENTS**

All breeding swine must have had a negative pseudorabies test on or after September 8, 2011, or must originate from a Qualified Pseudorabies Negative Swine Herd, and the herd number, test results, and date of the last herd test shall be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

MARKET SWINE

- Brucellosis and Pseudorabies Testing Requirements for Market Swine:**

- (a). **Brucellosis:** No brucellosis test is required for market swine sold for immediate slaughter.

- (b). **Pseudorabies:** All market swine must have had a negative pseudorabies test on or after September 8, 2011, or must originate from a Qualified Pseudorabies Negative Swine Herd, and the herd number, test results, and date of the last herd test shall be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

3. **OWNERSHIP** - Animal must be bona fide property of and owned by the exhibitor by August 1, 2011, as recorded on registration certificate. Certificate must accompany animal to the EXPOSITION and be presented upon demand any time during the EXPOSITION. All breeding swine to be SOLD must have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection within thirty (30) days (on or after September 8, 2011) of the sale date. Only original registration papers and litter papers are to be submitted. No copies or faxed copies will be accepted.
4. **ENTRY FEE** - PLA Member \$23.00 per pen. Non-Member \$46.00 per pen. (see rule 11, page 10) A minimum of two (2) and a maximum of five (5) animals are allowed per pen, which may be used for breeding swine and barrows. A limited number of dividers are available, it is suggested that animals be penned together at home in order to meet the minimum number. However, Management has the right to create the maximum use of pens with no refunds. **NEW RULE:** Open Breeding Swine exhibitors also exhibiting in the Open Barrow Show must purchase additional

pens at the above rates, i.e. **Breeding Swine**, 1 PLA Member pen, \$23 and **Open Barrow**, 1 PLA member pen \$23 for total \$46.00. All exhibitors must purchase a minimum of one pen per each show entered.

5. **SHOWING** - Each Animal in the showing must be accompanied by a showman.
6. **Premiums** - All premiums are subject to change by show management dependent upon funding support.
7. **ENTRY LIMITS**- Individuals or firms are permitted to only enter and show two animals in any one class.
8. **SUBSTITUTION**- Substitutions within breed and within sex will be permitted and, if made, must be filed with the superintendent no later than the time animals are checked in the EXPOSITION by the breed clerks.
9. **PENS**- assignments will be made by superintendent. No animals permitted in pens except those entered in the Show.
10. **BEDDING**- Straw and ground corncobs are the only bedding materials permitted. A deduction in premiums will be made for use of other materials. Initial bedding will not be provided. It must be furnished by the exhibitor. Straw will be available for purchase at the feed room.
11. **IDENTIFICATION**- Evidence of fresh ear notches or a lack of ear notches will disqualify the animal. See special rules on identification on page 139.
12. **SLICK SHEARING** of animals is strongly discouraged. Market barrows must have a minimum hair length of one half inch.
13. **ARRIVAL TIME**- Breeding swine must be in the pen by 3:00 p.m. Thursday, October 6. All Breeds showing on Thursday must be in the pen by 12:00 Noon Thursday, October 6. No animals may be unloaded between 11:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. Barns will open at 12:00 noon, Wednesday, October 5.
14. **CHECK IN**- Exhibitors must check in health papers with the Bureau of Animal Industry Staff upon arrival. Exhibitor's entry acceptance letters will explain the health check-in procedure. Exhibitors must also check in all animals with registration papers with the breed clerks between 10:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m., Thursday, October 6. Breeds showing on Thursday must be checked in with their registration papers with the show committee by 1:00 p.m. All other entries must be checked in by 4:00 p.m. Exhibitors whose animals are not checked in by 4:00 p.m. will not be eligible to show.
15. A committee, representing show management, will observe the handling of all animals, both in and out of the show ring and will have the authority to disqualify any exhibitor for unethical practices.
16. **RELEASE TIME**- Breeding swine will be released from the barn at the conclusion of the show, FRIDAY, OCTOBER 7. ANY EXHIBITOR REMOVING ANY ANIMALS FROM THE BARN BEFORE RELEASE TIME WILL FORFEIT ALL PREMIUM MONEY.
17. **SALE**- Animals entered in the show may be eligible to be sold in the Keystone Classic All Breed Sale. See specifications on page 138.
18. **PREMIER EXHIBITOR SPECIAL AWARD**- Will be awarded in each breed to the exhibitor winning the most points in individual classes. Championships will not be included. Points will be granted as follows: 1st - 6pts; 2nd - 5pts; 3rd - 4pts; 4th - 3pts; 5th - 2pts; 1 point to each additional entry in a class. In case of a tie, the award will be given to the exhibitor with the greater number of higher placing.
19. **OUTSTANDING ACCOUNTS** - If monies are owed to the show for any reason, the premium checks will be held until restitution is made of the outstanding accounts.

20. **NEW RULE: Trailer Parking** – All trailers will be permitted to parked on-site. Off-site parking is encouraged Please see the map on page 171 for directions.
21. **Berkshire** – All Berkshire swine must be registered by the American Berkshire Association (ABA), PO Box 2436, 1769 US 52 West, West Lafayette, In 47996. Said registration paper must be presented at time of check in. The ABA is the only Berkshire swine registry recognized by the National Association of Swine Records (NASR) and the National Pedigreed Livestock Council (NPLC).
22. Classes of 30 head or more will be split at the discretion of Show Management by age, and pay out will be based on the sliding scale of 15+ head for each group.

IMPORTANT

“Use only grooming products that are approved for use on meat producing animals when fitting any animal for show. Unapproved products may contain ingredients that result in unacceptable residues in the meat. If it is not certain that a product is residue safe and approved for use on meat animals, do not use it! ****Important!**** If upon slaughter, treatment with drugs, biologics, or any chemical from fitting products, is the cause of condemnation of a carcass, the loss of the carcass and any other damages will be borne by the exhibitor.”

The National Junior Swine Association Eastern Regional is sponsored by the National Swine Registry in conjunction with the Keystone International Livestock Exposition. The Eastern Regional will consist of three (3) contests that will contribute points towards a sweepstakes award in the following age divisions as of January 1, 2011; Novice (8 and under); Junior (9 – 12); Intermediate (13 – 16) and Senior (17 – 21). The contest will be a purebred gilt show (Duroc, Hampshire, Landrace and Yorkshire registered gilts only), showmanship contest and a skillathon. In each contest the contestants will compete in the age divisions as printed above. This event is organized by the National Swine Registry. All entries and questions for the contest must be directed to the NSR at (765) 463-3594 or P. O. Box 2417, West Lafayette, IN 47996-2417.

GILT SHOW RULES

1. All exhibitors must be members of the National Junior Swine Association or have completed a membership application for the NJSA.
2. Exhibitors must be 21 years of age or younger as of January 1, 2010.
3. Entries will be limited to two (2) gilts per exhibitor.
4. All entries must be made through the NSR, PO Box 2417, West Lafayette, IN 47996
5. Entries must be registered Duroc, Hampshire, Landrace or Yorkshire gilts that have farrowed on or after January 1, 2011.
6. Entries can be purchased females, but must have been transferred to the junior exhibitor, exhibitor's family or exhibitor's farm name before August 1, 2011.
7. Gilts can be registered in the junior's name, exhibitor's family or farm name.
8. Junior exhibitor's gilts must meet the same health requirements as the open show.
9. No entries accepted at the show.
10. Breed classes will be broken according to farrowing dates with the class size as equal as possible.
11. Gilt show points will be given on the exhibitor's highest placing animal toward the final Sweepstake Awards.
12. All NJSA Eastern Regional Show junior gilts must be in their pens by **4:00 p.m., Friday, October 7**. Gilts shown in both the KILE open show and NJSA may not be unloaded and penned before 12:00 noon, Wednesday, October 5 and must be in the pen by Noon Thursday, October 6.
13. Check In: Exhibitors must check in their gilts with registration papers between 12:00 p.m. and 4:00 p.m. on Friday, October 7.
14. Release Time: All junior gilts will be released from the barn at the conclusion of the Awards Ceremony Saturday, October 8. An exhibitor that removes any animals from the barn before release time will forfeit all premium money and awards.
15. All exhibitors must provide their own bedding, straw and corncobs ONLY. Shavings are NOT allowed. Straw will be available for purchase in the Feed

Room.

16. No entry fee is required if the junior exhibitor has also entered the open KILE breeding show and pen fees have been paid to KILE. There is a \$14.00 pen fee for junior exhibitors entered only in the Eastern Regional.
NEW RULE: A minimum of 2 and a maximum of 5 animals are allowed per pen
17. Entries must be postmarked by August 27, 2011.
18. **NEW RULE:** ***ALL TRAILERS*** may be parked on-site. Off-site trailer parking is encouraged. Please see the map on page 171 for directions.
